

CONSTITUENT MANIFESTO FOR FEDERAL EUROPE

► The European Union, as it exists today, **is not a state, not a federation, not a political power.**

It is an unfinished structure, devoid of real sovereignty, incapable of defending its own strategic interests, dependent on external actors for its security, energy, and international credibility.

This condition is no longer sustainable.

A single historical objective

The immediate and non-negotiable political objective is: **the construction of a sovereign Federal Europe**, endowed with political, military, economic, and decision-making power, **within a defined timeframe (5–10 years).**

Everything that does not directly contribute to this objective must be abandoned:

- abstract global federalism
- indefinite UN reforms
- endless functional integrations
- historical nostalgia and debates of the past

A serious political project **cannot have many strategic goals.**

2. The End of the Global Utopia

World peace **is not the prerequisite** for a federal Europe.

If anything, the opposite is true: **without a politically sovereign Europe, no international order is possible.**

Global federalism today:

- has no material basis
- has no popular consensus
- has no coercive instruments
- has no real political actors

Europe must first **exist as a body of power.**

Break with Gradualism

Seventy years of gradualism have produced:

- constant postponements

- technocracy without politics
- permanent compromise in place of decision-making

Gradualism is **no longer a tool**; it has become an excuse.

An explicit constituent decision is needed.

4. Method: Federal Constituent Act

The construction of a federal Europe must take place through:

A small initial core group

A group of states willing to move forward (5–7), without veto power for those left out.

Unanimity is the main historical enemy of political Europe.

Elected Constituent Assembly

- Direct election by the citizens of the member states
- Single mandate: draft a Federal Constitution
- Maximum term: 18 months

No opaque treaties. No endless revisions.

Essential federal powers

At the beginning, only:

- Common defense
- Foreign policy
- Strategic industrial policy
- Autonomous federal budget
- Energy and infrastructure security

The rest remains with the member states.

5. Sovereignty means strength

Without strength:

- There is no sovereignty
- There is no foreign policy
- There is no credibility

We need:

- A federal European army
- A single command
- An integrated European military industry
- An end to strategic dependence on the US

Not for aggression, but for **political existence**.

6. Popular Legitimacy

A federal Europe must speak the language of reality:

- security
- jobs
- protection

- future

Citizens understand necessity, not abstractions.

7. New Political Architecture

- Downsized Commission
- Federal Parliament with real legislative power
- Federal Government accountable to Parliament
- Federal Constitutional Court

The end of a Europe of officials.

The beginning of a Europe of decisions.

8. Final Declaration

A federal Europe **is not a moral dream.**

It is a **historical necessity.**

Either it emerges as a political power,
or it disappears as an irrelevant space.
